Fun playing mini-golf last Sunday! We had 15 kids (including visitors) and 5 adults having a great time










Two of our young people have achieved great honors!



Code Purple statistics from October 31st - March 11th

90 total nights

5,967 stays — average 66/night **VRQ:** 4,246 stays — average 47

TrV: 1,721 (including 8 children) — average 19

Code Purple nights are close to double over this time last year.

The 2023/24 Code Purple (CP) season at Transformation Village (TrV) has been very busy. To date Buncombe County has experienced 90 code purple nights and TrV has sheltered unhoused women and children for 1721 stays. Ginger Hicks, dedicated volunteers, and six TrV residents have ensured that CP guests receive a warm place to sleep, food, clothing, hygiene kits, and as much "wrap around" support as possible. We strive to


ensure that all guests are treated with dignity and respect! Eight children were served during CP. Older Code Purple guests were careful to monitor their language when children were being sheltered.

The TrV residents, employed by ABCCM to work the midnight to 8:00 AM shift, have thrived! One resident is also managing the shelter intake process five nights a week. This employment opportunity has allowed the residents to enhance critical work skills – responsibility, punctuality, and communication. The residents successfully managed the shelter during a stomach flu outbreak. They also managed well on a night when a frozen sprinkler pipe triggered the fire system – all CP guests and residents were required to exit the facility into the bitter cold. The residents are patient and kind – they love helping make our CP guests' lives better for the short time they are in our shelter.


With the help of TrV CP volunteers, residents, and staff our CP guests' lives have been positively impacted as well. One guest has been accepted into a physical rehabilitation facility, one married and moved to FL for employment, and one has received an inherence and can now afford to secure housing. Others have obtained social security cards and driver's licenses; been treated at the ABCCM medical clinic; and entered rehabilitation.

As the CP season continues, please pray for those who are unhoused in our community. Also, a huge thank you to the volunteers who have worked so diligently to support our CP shelter.


Explorers Class

We are studying What's The Least I can Believe and Still Be a Christian? by Martin Thielen.


Women's Bible Study


