The fall is a good time to make sure we are grounded in our faith. When I was first appointed to Weaverville UMC we reviewed what United Methodists believe by following the Adam Hamilton's book "Creed" about the Apostle's Creed. It's hard to believe, but that was three years ago. This time we are going to discuss our Wesleyan theology through the lens of the Nicene Creed. From September 7 through October 12 we will be using Micheal Carpenter's book "We Believe: How the Nicene Creed Can Deepen Your Faith" as we reexamine what United Methodist's believe. To help with that for the next six weeks we will make a swap. We will recite the Nicene Creed instead of the Apostle's Creed in worship. Then we will switch back. The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.





Explorer Class is studying <u>Ruthless Trust</u> by Brennan Manning. The meeting takes place in the Love Conference Room at 10 am.




Ignite Class
