Brian Witcher Recipient of Rev. Dennis W. "Bud" Cameron Christian Service Award – Western NC Conference of the United Methodist Church

Brian Witcher, Trustee Chair, Youth Adult Volunteer, Outreach Volunteer of Weaverville United Methodist Church (WUMC) has been awarded the 2025 Rev. Dennis W. "Bud" Cameron Christian Service Award.

This award is given in honor and memory of Rev. Dennis W. "Bud" Cameron (1947-2023), who faithfully served God and others through his life, his work and his ministry across both the Western North Carolina Conference and the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. It recognizes and celebrates people who, like Cameron, have selflessly devoted their lives to Christian service. Bud Cameron believed God calls us to Christian service to help other, lift others up.

Vickie Cameron, widow of Bud Cameron contacted Brian in June to notify him he was the recipient of the 2025 award. Rev. Cameron's daughter, Mary Gordon and family presented Brian with the Rev. Dennis W. "Bud" Cameron Christian Service Award at a lunch celebration in July honoring Brian for his faithful service during the aftermath of Helene in serving some of the most underserved communities in Buncombe County. He was presented with a beautiful cross-shaped pin and a check for \$500 to use at his discretion or donate to an organization of his choice.

We are thrilled to celebrate Brian Witcher as the recipient of the Bud Cameron Service Award, recognizing his extraordinary commitment to serving God and his community. Brian's faith is unmistakable—he doesn't just talk about Christ's love; he lives it.

When our church went more than a year without a youth leader, Brian stepped forward, creating programs and activities that kept our young people engaged and helped deepen their faith. His leadership has strengthened the next generation of our church family.

Brian's dedication became even more visible after Hurricane Helene. At his own expense and the donations of others, he navigated closed roads to bring essential supplies—truckloads of water, bread, and peanut butter—and organized a drive-by food distribution with our youth group. In the weeks that followed, he made it his personal mission to seek out the most vulnerable families living in the region's aging trailer parks—people often overlooked in

large-scale relief efforts. Nearly every day, Brian loaded his truck or trailer with food, water, heaters, and propane, driving deep into remote neighborhoods where resources were scarce. He went door-to-door and waited in parking lots at the end of work shifts to hand out supplies directly, ensuring families could use their limited income for rent and heating instead of groceries.

He also used his outdoor skills to help clear blocked roads in the Reems Creek Valley, led rescue efforts to reach vulnerable residents, and hiked rugged terrain to check on stranded families. Time and again, Brian has shown up often sacrificing his own time and comfort—to ensure others are cared for. Brian Witcher embodies the heart of Christian service. His tireless work and steady compassion reflect the light of Christ, bringing hope, dignity, and love to our community. We are honored to recognize his service with this year's Bud Cameron Service Award.

Although the award specifically recognizes Brian, his family Ericka, Southern and Skye were also very helpful in managing the delivered supplies. Brian recently retired from the U.S. National Park Service as an Ecologist. Please congratulate Brian on this most deserved award.






